Dear All,

As a surveyor, valuer and builder with more than 30 years experience, I decided to apply my methods of presentation of the condition and repair of property to a look at our planet. The result is this report on the property known as:

The Earth, Milky Way Galaxy

in order to comment on its condition and to advise on the extent and nature of the remedial works essential to enable its restoration, preservation and balanced evolution, along with its inhabitants.

In view of the potential enormity of the task, this report should not be construed as a 'full structural survey', rather it is a 'schedule of condition' intended to highlight issues of major significance to the stability of the 'property'. Essentially, a survey aims to ascertain what's defective, why it's defective and how to fix it. Therefore, this report will seek to establish the principal elements that are in disrepair, the extent and nature of the defects and the means of repair or replacement.

The term 'pollution factors' is used to refer to issues that are contributing significantly to the defects. The 'works' or the 'contract' refers to all actions necessary to eradicate the pollution factors.

The report is provided as an opportunity to invite any and all other human beings to contribute their expertise, views, ideas and projects to accomplish the 'works'. In this way, we can choose to pool our resources to undertake the detailed design and implementation of the essential works of repair, refurbishment and replacement. Indeed, it is envisaged that the 'contract' represents an opportunity for all of humanity to choose new creative vocations. Thereby, the restoration and refurbishment of our World will guarantee permanent full global employment by choice. Indeed, the process will produce an entirely new world socio-economic structure founded on the innate ability of humankind to create beauty and goodness.

As a starting position, it is important to remain aware that the subject of this report is our Home. Therefore, it is our right and duty to survey the structures and systems that control us or influence our lives. In so doing, we must examine the processes and actions of the 'managers'. This is especially important when destruction, pollution, inequality, separation, suffering, sickness, injustice and war are the continual outcomes of their 'management'.

DESCRIPTION AND SITUATION

Earth is the third planet from the Sun and the largest of the terrestrial planets in our solar system in diameter, mass and density. It is also referred to as the World and Terra.

It is home to millions of species, including humans, and is estimated to have formed some 4.54 billion years ago. Its atmosphere, and other environmental factors, enable the proliferation of breathing organisms as well as the formation of the ozone layer, which, together with Earth's magnetic field, blocks harmful radiation, permitting life on land.

There are five principal parts of the Earth system. Each part has its own collection of materials and processes. However, the parts do not operate on their own, they all interact in many ways to contribute to and sustain the whole:-

The Atmosphere extends up from the Earth surface for several hundred kilometres. The lowest part is home to clouds and weather.

The Biosphere is all living things, from single-celled bacteria to plants and animals.

The Geosphere includes all minerals, rocks, molten rock, sediments, and soils (although there are important living components to soils as well).

The Hydrosphere includes the ocean, rivers, lakes, streams, groundwater, water vapour, and even puddles.

The Cryosphere is the frozen part of the Earth system and includes snow, glaciers, and sea ice.

The Sun has a large impact on the Earth and so it is also considered a part of the Earth system. Almost all the energy on Earth comes from the Sun. The factors outside the planet, like the Sun and solar system, which have an impact on the Earth system, are sometimes called the **Exosphere**.

The mineral deposits of the planet, along with the products of the living biosphere, contribute essential resources for the support of the global human population of some 6.5 billion persons. Notably, everything grows freely on the planet, due to abundant supplies of sunshine and water, along with an incredible diversity of nutrients, plant and animal life. The human inhabitants are grouped into about 200 independent sovereign states, which interact in many ways including communication, entertainment, education, travel, trade, research and military action.

Human cultures have developed many and diverse views of the Earth, including personification as a deity, a belief in a flat Earth, and the modern perspective of the World as an integrated environment that requires stewardship. It could be considered an understatement to say that the endless displays of immense natural beauty on our Home are legendary and awe-inspiring.

CONSTRUCTION AND CONDITION

It is clear for all to see that only human beings act contrary to the natural flow of nature. Therefore, we need look no further than ourselves to find the 'guilty party' in any analysis of the overall condition of our planet, the 'pollution factors' and the resultant damage. In other words, whilst the scale of the defects can be viewed as vast, their source is found in only one species.

Therefore, this report will point only to topics and areas of major significance to enable the essential understanding of why and how we act in ways that cause such damage. In this way, it is intended to present the general overview considered essential to enable the design and implementation of a schedule for comprehensive refurbishment and renewal of essential structures and systems. Fortunately, this requirement implies immediate, creative and permanent 'vocational employment' for all of humankind.

MATTER

The World we detect with our 5 senses is formed as 'matter'. Matter has mass and volume. It comes in five main states known as condensate, solid, liquid, gas and plasma. In simple terms, for the purpose of this report, we should be aware that the essence of our World is movement and opposites. That is to say, matter is formed from minute 'bits' of spinning light, which vibrate and flow in waves of energy. This flow generates positive and negative polarities, just like battery terminals or the opposite ends of a magnet. The movement of the energy creates the magnetic fields that bind everything together. The vibrations 'mould' the chemical elements and 'generate' the sounds that shape our World.

In effect, this continual movement enables opposites to become bound together in our World – positive:negative, big:small, hot:cold, good:bad, light:dark, love:fear and so on. What's more, the space between the 'bits' is comparable to that between stars and planets. That is to say, matter is

only about 0.001% 'solid' because it contains space with a volume some 100,000 times greater than the 'bits' travelling through it. However, because the 'bits' travel at immense speed, matter appears solid to us, in the same way as fast-moving spokes in a wheel or blades in a fan. To illustrate the point, if the 'bits' in a hydrogen atom (i.e. one electron orbiting one proton) were enlarged to the size of footballs, the electron would be found some 20 miles away from the proton in the centre.

In effect, our senses trick us into thinking that we live in a 'solid World'. Our body is like the 'joy pad' of a computer game, where our 5 senses activate the 'control buttons' of the human mind. With the knowledge that all the 'bits' are formed from spinning light, we can understand that we are part of a 'light show'. The images appear solid because we are watching from inside a human body, which itself is part of the 'show'. The nature of the 'watcher' or 'soul' has long been debated.

A huge mirror image of this effect is visible when we look out into space. Indeed, relativity has shown that our experience on this planet is comparable to a 'compacted version' of what we observe in the vastness of the Universe. So, the age-old hermetic saying 'as above, so below' is confirmed. The significance of this phrase is that for millennia it has been believed to hold the key to all mysteries. That is, all systems of magic are claimed to function by the formula: "That which is above is the same as that which is below; macro-cosmos is the same as micro-cosmos; the Universe is the same as God; God is the same as man; the atom is the same as the solar system, the cell is the same as the galaxy...and so on, ad infinitum." This analogy is of major significance when considering our actual nature and Source.

The space within the 'light show' is pulsating with 'background' energy, known as electromagnetic radiation. This energy fills the space in matter just as it fills space throughout the universe. The electrical and magnetic energies from the human body radiate mostly as infra-red and thermal energy. Radiation across the larger body of the universe consists of waves of energy at numerous frequencies of light, known as the electromagnetic spectrum. 'Outer Space' appears dark to us because our bodies are tuned to only one octave in this spectrum. In fact, the spectrum has numerous octaves, which contain all known light frequencies from radio through microwaves, infra-red, visible light, ultraviolet, x-rays, gamma rays and cosmic rays. This underlying 'structural' energy, also known as spirit or prana, bonds the entire Universe as one pulsating energy 'matrix'. This understanding is of vital importance when contemplating the real essence of universal construction and the Oneness of our reality.

CONDITION

Physical Pollution

There is abundant evidence to confirm the physical and environmental pollution of our planet and its species. As already mentioned, we need look no further than ourselves to find the culprits. Hence, this report is limited to examination of the source and nature of the pollution and damage. In other words, the reasons why it occurs. A survey must find the nature, extent and the source of any infestation before it can be eradicated. In this case, as humankind is the obvious perpetrator of the damage, we must explore the stimulus for our actions in order to resolve the problems.

Mental Pollution

A casual observer could be forgiven for a statement to the effect that humankind has arrived into the third millennium A.D. resembling a confused and traumatised adolescent. Certainly, and often, we appear to have more in common with the hierarchy of violent emotions found in a group of chimpanzees than family members of an all wise and benevolent God or creative Source. Indeed, we display abundant evidence of a group long-traumatised by fears of many kinds. Meantime, clues to our unrealised, or forgotten, potential appear continually in the 'spring' of creativity, compassion and love that flows from our species.

MIND

Our human mind develops after we are born and as we become aware of our World. Of course, the location of our birth has a huge effect on how we develop as human beings. Nevertheless, in all cases, each individual personality is the sum of the memories and habits acquired since arrival here. So, our human mind is programmed by numerous external factors, which determine our attitudes, values and culture.

Despite the vast range of individual personalities that have developed, it is true to say that all humans share the same innate longing for happiness. Fundamentally, this equates to a deep need for freedom from scarcity – i.e. lack of food, shelter, education, knowledge, love, creative fulfilment and so on – and, as a result, freedom from fear. Indeed, were we to wash our human minds of memories and habits, we would find this underlying consciousness seeking happiness in everybody, everywhere. In effect, we share a consciousness, which gives us innate awareness of our essential need for freedom from scarcity and fear.

Since this basic freedom has been lacking significantly in many human lives for much of recorded history, this report must consider the repercussions in the human mind when scarcity and fear prevail. Further, an analysis of the nature of real freedom is required to ensure the adequacy of our schedule of refurbishment. In the process, we must aim to uncover why we act contrary both to our common inner consciousness and to our Oneness, as evident in the construction of our World. That is to say, as we investigate our imbalances, we need to establish why the human mind leads us to actions, and habits, that guarantee damage and pollution. Simultaneously, we must find out why we ignore, or suppress, our common consciousness in its quest for freedom from scarcity and fear.

Initially, it would assist us to accept that we have created a World in which we have become trapped by the very issues from which we seek freedom. Indeed, our human minds appear to be functioning as the polar opposite of our underlying collective consciousness. So, with the understanding that our mutual quest for freedom is founded in love of life, it is apparent that the human mind has become trapped in fear of life.

In our self-analysis, it is wise to consider the inevitability of our condition for a number of reasons:

- our reality is constructed of polarities, or opposites, bound together in constant movement.
- we live unaware of the nature or effects of the 'light show' presented by our 5 senses
- our 'education' doesn't lead us to seek, find or understand our source, purpose or potential
- our 'life-style' fails to equip us with the knowledge or experience to be truly free

FREEDOM

Freedom is letting go and realising we are absolutely free to be what we consent to be on this planet. Essentially, it is something everybody would love to do and be, while not believing they can have. The keys to freedom are found in the search for truth – the truth of who and what we really are - so our new structures and systems must enable us to choose this pursuit as a fundamental tool of education. Beginning at our current state of relative confusion, it entails allowing oneself to revolt and change, so that we can become what we are not.

This process of self-evolution requires us to watch our thoughts in order to learn how our memories and habits trap us in ignorance of the full truth of who we are. In the process, we must become aware of the ways in which our current reality is engineered. Quite simply, this mental self-purification involves taking advantage of the joy of being conscious. We need to know that we can choose to be free of ignorance and indifference; to know that to be free in the World, we must be free of the World. When we refuse to 'play the game', we are out of it. We are free to act from the heart of love and to co-create a new reality.

Thus, real education is 'Education for Truth' because discovery of the truth requires discernment of the false. An ignorant man is ignorant of his ignorance but as soon as ignorance is seen, it disappears. In this World we mistake the false for the true because, from our birth onwards, the structures and systems 'conspire' to create and to reinforce our values, prejudices, ambitions and fears. So, we grow up with unconscious fears, which serve to maintain this mental 'trap' as the cause of our common ignorance. In this state, we are destined to sustain and repeat the self-inflicted 'damage' of the past. Acceptance of our false condition is essential to our collective awakening and vital to our ability to refurbish our Home.

Essentially, to find the real happiness, which our consciousness desires, our new structures and systems must be redesigned to foster peace and harmony. To have peace and harmony in the world, we must have peace and harmony in our hearts and minds. Clearly, this sets the base criteria for our new designs since they must be tested against their ability to achieve the desired outcomes. So, new methods of evaluation need to be applied to our structures and systems during and after their development. By this means we can expect to guarantee that the pollution factors are eradicated for good. In effect, we require only solutions that will enable us to apply the freedom to let go, so that we can live in peace and harmony.

In this process, we must adopt an open-minded attitude and seek out those with the higher understanding required to achieve our aims. We require a wise, dispassionate viewpoint to remove blame or judgement, leaving our 'contract' as an opportunity for hands-on self-education and self-evolution. As we revive our connection to our inner consciousness, we will find that awareness and recognition of our inherent Oneness are fundamental to our escape to real freedom.

This opportunity to evolve to a wise and loving species challenges us to summon the humility to acknowledge our imbalances. To ease matters, we can accept our condition as the stage in growing up when we begin to recognise our latent talents. This will help us to rise to a frequency of committed hope and excitement, which is the frame of mind necessary for balanced radical growth. From there, we will be equipped to summon the courage and wisdom to develop the essential new structures, systems and management. Indeed, the process will become great fun as we open our minds to the opportunities and freedom available in a World of infinite potential.

Clearly, we must focus on the means to eradicate fear from the human mind, as a priority. Therefore, we must trace the source and nature of our fear. We may expect to find the mystery surrounding our source, our purpose and our potential as human beings at the root of our insecurity.

HUMANKIND AND ITS STRUCTURES

Designers and Managers

A survey and valuation report that relates to the upgrade of property should advise on the logic for its recommendations. For example, the selection of a programme of repair and refurbishment, as against a partial or complete redevelopment. Generally, the underlying factors relate to issues of economic and social viability, such as cost, value and appearance. In this case, it is evident that the original intent of the designers, along with the continued misuse of the structures, has created an adverse stress on the principal individual human 'property' of body and mind. Thus, we have become closed off from our 'happiness-seeking' consciousness.

Because we live in a World of polarities, or opposites, we must consider the inevitability that some people will always crave power and control. Indeed, it is logical to assume that they will regard it as their right to manage affairs as they see fit, due to their mind-set. For certain, our history bears witness to the actions of such 'leaders'. The fact that 'absolute power corrupts absolutely' has been well proven, as has the concept that 'the victor writes the history'. Hence, we must find the wisdom and the willpower to end all forms of tyranny en route to eradication of fear from the human mind.

Fundamental flaws in the design and operation of the structures we have created on our planet are not difficult to discover. We need look no further than the negative outcomes from our activities – inequality, prejudice, judgement, terror, devastation, sickness, starvation, abuse, manipulation and war - to find clear evidence that something is very wrong. Even so, it is clear also that many of our structures do work, to varying degrees, for the benefit of some forms of life, sometimes.

Of major significance is analysis of the main elements of the structures and their applications to assess whether they can be put to good use for alternative aims and objectives. In other words, whether the current design can be enhanced to enable preferred outcomes pertaining to collective freedom, peace and harmony. Therefore, we need to be aware of the motivation behind the original design brief, how and why those elements are now flawed, the options for redesign and a specification for job.

Attitudes and Values

The work of designers is usually dictated by a hierarchy of values and aims, interpreted by experience, personal beliefs and end-user requirements. Appropriately, it is these same elements that trigger the memories and habits of the human mind. A survey of the design, operation and management of our structures reveals numerous entrenched values and control systems as major factors of pollution. Indeed, 'the status quo' often appears to present 'freedom' as an opportunity for so-called 'elites' to manage outdated structures to our collective detriment.

We can observe how life evolves in a process of continual action and how lack of movement leads to entrapment and disorder. So, we are challenged, indeed obligated, to avoid rigid and entrenched thinking because it leads to stagnation, violence and rot. The reappearance of a power-struck 'character role' over countless millennia can be understood as a repeated learning opportunity for the 'watching majority'. Simply put, it is enlightening for us to understand that the need for power and control is the reaction of some characters to the fears in their human mind.

Acknowledging that we live under stress due to dysfunctional and outdated thought processes will enable us to build in safeguards in order to avoid old design flaws. Thus far, the designs of the past have led to turmoil and confusion, which have been reflected mentally and physically across our planet. Now we are challenged to pinpoint and eliminate the offending elements by introducing alternative structures and systems. A major feature of our design brief must be to provide elements that introduce and enable higher knowledge, compassionate service and love of life.

It is useful to accept the parallel to this opportunity in our individual lives, when adverse situations force us to rethink and 'start over'. Essentially, we learn and grow when 'stress factors' force us to re-evaluate our lives, create fresh opportunities and seek higher standards. So, our new structures and systems should work to enable the transformation of the attitudes and values that perpetuate the pollution factors. Clearly, we need to develop and agree new values and aims so that our design criteria are founded on a renewed understanding of ourselves as humankind.

In designing our new structures and systems, can there be a better starting point than to place the common good of humankind, our planet and all life as the fundamental issue?

Certainly, to dissolve our 'mental box', we must find ways to allow ourselves opportunities to have real fun, to find freedom and to know happiness. In the process, we will be released to explore our true source, purpose and potential.

BLUEPRINT FOR THE REDESIGN

We can list the essential nature of the 'infestations' to be eradicated in relation to an overview of the type of World we wish to create. In so doing, we must outline the principal features and functions required from our new structures and systems. Our specification must be able to eradicate or replace the failed elements of the current structures in order to achieve our desired

outcomes.

Pollution Factors: Scarcity, Stress, Separation, Mistrust, Inequality, Poverty, Sickness, Starvation, Escapism, Ignorance, Judgement, Prejudice, Egocentricity, Elitism, Confusion, Hatred, Terrorism, War and Fear of Life.

Our 'New World': As we begin to understand and eradicate the pollution factors, we will create opportunities to reorganise, redesign and replace the structures, systems and management that contribute to the damage. These are essential elements to stabilise the foundations of our new structures and systems:

- The guarantee of freedom from scarcity, debt, violence, surveillance and control
- The opportunity to live exciting and creative lives in pursuit of our innate talents
- The means to innovate, bond and collaborate on projects to fulfil our objectives
- The recognition that our creative emergence depends on openness to foster trust
- The provision of communal debt-free banking structures to fund the 'works'
- The understanding to live and grow in awe and in gratitude for our unlimited potential
- The commitment to find solutions and to create new lives as we undertake the 'works'.

THE 'CONTRACT' AND THE 'WORKS'

This section of the report comprises a brief overview of the principal structures and systems that require urgent remedial work. As such, their refurbishment or replacement will form the major part of the 'contract'. As stated in the introduction, the detailed analysis and design work required is our common challenge and opportunity. Indeed, the global nature of the 'contract' highlights the need for collaboration on a mass scale not before experienced. Success requires us to acknowledge our Oneness, to contribute our skills, to pool our resources and to work together for our common good. Essentially, this project is the opportunity we require to serve ourselves in a revitalised World.

PRELIMINARIES AND 'GROUNDWORKS'

Any major redevelopment project requires initial actions to prepare the site for the job in hand and to ensure stability at all stages of the works. The following are considered essential preliminary issues that will enable the detailed design and construction stages to be implemented:

COMMUNITY COLLABORATION

The phenomena of social networking is cascading across the internet and demonstrating the deep human need for interaction, openness and trust. Long-undervalued human attributes are emerging, assisted by availability of interactive systems of communication. Indeed, the mass collaboration essential for successful delivery of this global project has already appeared on-line. The 'trick' is to translate this emergent culture into real-life communities. The timing couldn't be better as the collapse of the financial structures opens the doors for new solutions and innovations.

Harnessing the support of communities of many types calls for participation and co-innovation founded on co-ownership and connectedness. Focussed marketing of the concepts and solutions is vital to the task. In the U.K., the issue of local ownership can be solved by incorporation of a Community Interest Company (CIC), in which every member of a local community holds an equal share. No doubt similar models can be adopted in other countries to enable collective ownership.

A CIC, or equivalent, provides a community with a focal point around which it can bond and operate cohesively. Importantly, members can pool funds in the company bank account for local projects or services. The CIC should be managed by a local executive board and supported by non-executive boards of local experts. So, the members can elect to use their own company to provide services in education, health, sport, media, law, finance, local services, projects and so on.

They can contribute as part of a board or by providing other skills and services. This situation lays the foundations for sustainable growth of a new system, owned and managed 'by-the-people-for-the-people'.

A CIC can be created on an 'actual' or a 'virtual' basis. For instance, an 'actual' CIC would be based on location, owned and managed by residents within a city, town or village. The virtual form would enable specific interest groups to combine their skills and services. So, musicians, media producers, health practitioners, sports groups, educators, tradespeople, construction professionals, farmers, traders, lawyers, relief workers, and so on, could join forces and create 'virtual' CIC's on a local, regional, national or international basis. The 'virtual' CIC's could sub-contract to the 'actual' CIC's, their equivalent, or other organisations, anywhere in the World. Indeed, the entire process would be a hands-on learning opportunity.

Organisations and project co-ordinators of all types can create CIC's, or simply employ them to deliver the required goods and services. For example, charities or other non-governmental organisations could hire media CIC's to assist with the creation and hosting of media content related to their projects. Similarly, a village CIC in Africa could employ a health, an education or a construction CIC to provide services. Aid could go directly to a CIC bank account, cut out the 'middle man' and empower the local community to select their own consultants.

Organic growth of the model will enable the formation of an interactive, international 'matrix' of companies, owned and managed by local people for their collective benefit. Thus, as the power of mass collaboration is harnessed and demonstrated, we will come to realise that we no longer have to give away power to the 'usual suspects'. Simultaneously, we will be able to mirror the scale of transnational corporations and, as such, be in a position to select from a huge array of proven technologies, management systems and expertise.

Funding and Investment

For the first time, communities anywhere will be able to gain direct and substantial economies of scale by pooling both their funds and their bills. For example, 5000 homes within a town or city could agree to pay £5 a week into their company bank account and so guarantee their own company an income of £1.3 million p.a. In addition, they could pool their bills with other CIC's to obtain bulk purchase discounts.

As a network of CIC's grows, a purchasing department could aggregate spending power and buy at prices to rival any supermarket or other enterprise. The skills and the premises required for storage and distribution will be readily found. Communities could use their new status to reopen and refurbish run-down high streets, manage public buildings or redevelop parks as centres for community leisure and hands-on education – imagine a project to build beautiful domes in parks for leisure, entertainment, arts and media production. Importantly, each element will offer opportunities for hands-on learning and support the viability of the debt-free learning currency.

A CIC could undertake 'a community audit' to establish the available range of local skill-sets and form or employ 'virtual' CIC's to deliver their local services. CIC's could operate the system of 'retrofit', whereby they carry out work for, say, 50% of the current annual budget, saving their own community and the local government 50%. As all works can be opportunities for hands-on learning (apprenticeships), the labour costs can be supplemented with debt-free currency from the learning bank. So, acceptance, sustainability and support for the new debt-free banking structure can be inbuilt into CIC operations. The opportunities for full creative employment combined with vast savings in current budgets for government expenditure are there for us to create.

Indeed, an entire new socio-economic structure can evolve, supported by debt-free funding. Pensioners paid to pass on their skills; students of all ages paid to find their talents and develop their skills; new economies founded on research, development and production of the goods, services and premises required for creative endeavour.

In replicating the system, we should not overlook the importance of the media and CIC-TV seems an obvious feature of our new people's consortia. Undoubtedly, the abilities and equipment are readily available for production of local media content. Availability of hands-on tuition from media CIC's seems a worthy feature for any self-respecting community venture, especially when supported by a debt-free learning bank. Professional standards and delivery systems will do much to convince a critical watching public that 'peoples' productions' are more varied, entertaining and worthwhile than most of the content churned out currently in 100's of 'professional' channels. The redirection of advertising revenues into local CIC's will serve to enhance their effectiveness and the positive outcomes.

By proving their worth and sustainability, CIC's will become viable, and preferable, investments for many types of investors. Indeed, it will be in the best interests of all concerned to establish the CIC as the safest and best investment around. The growing market in venture philanthropy funding, where philanthropic investors provide funds for worthy projects, will find an obvious outlet. Indeed, the potential exists for the emergence of local 'stock exchanges' in a win-win-win mirror-image of a shadier past.

Software

The structure of community companies can be interconnected on-line using interactive software to create a secure intranet for use by members only. The first example of software written specifically for this purpose is www.tgl.tv or 'The Green Light'. This package enables members to interact through a number of functions:

- Directory of websites, trade rooms, courses, community services, swap shop, free expertise
- Members' projects, ideas, discussions, blogs, shopping baskets
- A Learning Bank to pay members who choose to teach or learn in a currency known as 'L'
- A secure messaging system – intranet email
- Mytgl – a members personal library for videos, photos, audio and literature
- The Library – members' recommended links to videos, photos, audio and literature
- Pandora's Open Source Box – software offers from the open source community

Members enter their content directly into the database and moderation of content is carried out by the CIC, or equivalent, to maintain standards. The community company also administers the L Bank and provides the general day-to-day administrative functions relating to 'customer services'.

So, the growing 'matrix' of community companies can use and evolve its own software for its own benefits. Each community gains the potential for income from provision of the on-line commercial services to its members, along with advertising revenue and sponsorship.

Potential

As their collaborative power is harnessed and proven, people will be liberated to realise their unlimited opportunities for positive self and collective development. Growing levels of excitement and co-operation will enable enthusiasm and hope to replace apathy and stress. Indeed, the rapid growth of peering, openness and sharing in the virtual world of the internet will be replicated in the lives of actual communities. Then, humankind will come to know that 'unity liberates and freedom unites'. The potential for savings in and redistribution of global expenditure relating to stress, crime, disease, unemployment and war give an idea of the true value of the project.

STRUCTURES AND SYSTEMS

Banking and Finance

2008 was the year when the illusory nature of the stability and sustainability of these structures was revealed for certain. At the heart of the 'rot' is the design of a structure that functions only by the continual creation of debt, repayable and compounded with interest. This defect creates an

inbuilt 'drain' on our World since it generates scarcity. Put another way, the additional money needed to pay the interest charges is not made available. As a consequence, money is always in short supply for the vast majority of people on the planet, while the few that operate the systems hold the operational power required to maintain and influence all other structures.

Effectively, the structure places a false value on money because of its scarcity. Indeed, it guarantees production systems and attitudes focussed on the illusory goal of material abundance. So, we compete for the essential 'oil' required to enable production, trade, survival and relaxation. For the 'winners', 'success' comes down to accumulation of 'wealth', which can only be at the expense of the majority. Indeed, the system guarantees control by 'elites', whose forerunners designed the system originally. Governments must comply simply because their 'job' entails the 'management' of an exponential debt 'vortex'. In the process, 'the many go short, while the few prosper'.

Now, the 'financial wizards' have hugely weakened the banking structure with compounded debt and numerous diversions for financial gambling, such as 'derivatives markets'. Consequently, the accumulated debt grows faster than can be calculated with any relevant accuracy. The domino effects from this structural failure have led to the ongoing market crashes as 'debt bubbles' implode. Meantime, the defective structures continue under the same misguided management. Indeed, 'political strings are pulled from the wings' to guarantee that the 'rescue plan' is designed by them so that they retain overall control. Essentially, this complex web of international 'gambling' and manipulation, is symptomatic of the fearful and imbalanced minds at the centre of the 'rot' infestation.

Therefore, the first step to freedom lies in constructing an alternative and vastly simplified banking structure designed to fund the 'contract'. Essentially, it need be no more than a database that holds the names of people who choose to support the 'New World' view. In the new structure, 'money' will be no more than a 'ticket', or 'note', to be added or subtracted from names in the database. There is no need to charge interest as all operational costs can be accounted for by the new system. Thereafter, 'profit' can be measured in the rate of appearance of peace and harmony due to freedom from scarcity and fear.

Recommended Remedial Works:

- Create a new structure of databases in which members, individual or corporate, can choose to create and accept currencies relevant to any particular transaction.
- Market the concept that 'money' has value only as a 'ticket' to enable exchange.
- Enable the system to be administered and managed by local communities.
- Make the new currencies available for members who are engaged in the 'works'.
- Circulate all currencies free of interest or other charges
- Employ them to cover the costs of the new banking structures.
- Retain the current systems essential for analysis and evaluation of funding requirements.
- Progressively eliminate all forms of existing debt everywhere.
- Outlaw financial trading and all forms of currency speculation.

Company Law

The predominant 'fiduciary duty' of any company Director is to maximise the profit for the shareholder. The fact that this has led to the employment of malnourished adults and children for \$1 a day in appalling conditions, or poor quality control of railway maintenance, or environmental pollution, or weapons proliferation is irrelevant to the structure.

To stay employed, a Director must comply with shareholders' demands to maximise 'returns' as protection and accumulation of financial capital is the prime consideration. Meanwhile people, society and environment count only as 'servants' or 'commodities' bound by an imbalanced legal structure. Attempts to broaden the definition of 'profit' can only 'scratch the surface' of the pollution

factors.

Recommended Remedial Works:

- Amend and simplify Company Law so that Directors are legally bound to work to eradicate the pollution factors as an integral aspect of the purpose and role of any company or similar trading body.
- Ensure that all corporate bodies are managed by members of the new banking structure.
- Create a new fiduciary duty to foster trust in order to optimise profit in the form of the well-being of humankind and the good stewardship of our planet.

Education

'Educate', from its Latin base, implies 'to bring out from within', which in turn points to self-development and pursuit of innate talents. However, in the dysfunctional 'marketplace' outlined, education for the huge majority consists of absorbing and regurgitating enough 'facts' to get a job. Only those with unusual talent, luck, or connections in 'high places', have any real chance to choose their 'treadmill', or 'escalator', as a way of rising above the masses.

Even worse, in 'developing countries', education often equates to little more than very basic learning in the vague hope of attaining some better means of survival. Inevitably, a job anywhere usually serves only to maintain the 'status quo', which involves perpetuating the Pollution Factors. Relatively few are lucky and privileged enough to find and pursue a vocation that can satisfy their talents and inner potential.

Consequently, and especially in 'developed' countries, many skills and values are not passed on from generation to generation. Further, fixed curricula and teaching methods have created a regimented system populated by disillusioned teachers and students. As a result, creativity, purpose, potential, craftsmanship, tradition, health, enthusiasm, hope, balance, respect, freedom and genuine legacies are being lost or squandered. Indeed, we are becoming evermore dependant on technological and 'factory-made' solutions for everything. We need look no further than the loss of aesthetic beauty in the built environment for evidence of our folly.

Recommended Remedial Works:

- Create a currency to reward people of all ages everywhere for teaching and learning.
- Use the currency to support the development of a new global economy founded on the goods and services required by creative people working on the 'contract'.
- Ensure that elimination of the pollution factors becomes a hands-on learning opportunity.
- Make 'Education for Truth' central to the goals of freedom, peace and harmony.
- Aim for knowledge, freedom and self-development to be top of any personal 'wish list'.

Religion

There is a deep-rooted need for us to find our source, purpose and potential. Nowadays for 'religious' people, this translates to little more than belief in the concept of a 'God', whether benevolent, judgemental, or both. The need for truth is a reflection of our unconscious 'feeling' that there are answers more profound than mere hope for some type of 'insurance guarantee'. As our unconscious ignorance festers, our fears and insecurities are reinforced. This leads many of us 'rebel' against the notion of eternal life or real happiness. Instead, we turn to numerous forms of 'material' diversion to nullify the inner pain of not knowing.

Little wonder that the illusive power represented by the knowledge of life and death has always been assumed, or usurped, by an 'earthly hierarchy', often led by a tyrannical ruler, priesthood or both. The misappropriation of our innate search for truth and meaning is evident in countless centuries of persecution, torture, elitism and war in the name of religion and God. Rather than

satisfying our need to know our source, purpose and potential, religion has often been misused as the collaborative partner of the 'financial wizards'. Indeed, there is a common vested interest in maintaining 'business as usual' from hierarchical earthly 'thrones'. Certainly, 'war' is a most profitable 'business' and maintains the illusion of our need for 'heavenly' protection and 'elite' governance.

Recommended Remedial Works:

- Provide global access to the knowledge, expertise and practices necessary to enable personal and collective enlightenment on the core issues, including:
 - How we become the witness of our human mind
 - The true nature and source of consciousness
 - The basis of peace, harmony, freedom and happiness
 - Personal realisation of our purpose and potential
- Undertake a genuine open analysis and public exploration of all core issues
- Agree free access to all the archives of knowledge held by religious hierarchies
- Facilitate a new understanding of humankind in terms of our Oneness.
- Employ media to present the scope and nature of our opportunities to self-evolve.
- Foster the search for experiential truth as the new 'peer pressure' across our planet.

Media

There's 'No Show without Punch', and the saying epitomises the central role of 'illusion master', played by the 'media circus' as the puppet of the imbalanced structures, systems and management. Trend setter for fashions and fads, opinion former for political movers, disguiser of awkward facts, presenter of mindless 'entertainment'. The media, controlled by a handful of major corporations can be guaranteed to create and deliver the Show, 24/7.

Recommended Remedial Works:

- Support and encourage the growth of media 'by and for the people'.
- Use local CIC-TV as the central platform for tuition, concept development and production.
- Develop 'people's media' as an integral 'tool' to promote the focus on hands-on education.
- Ensure that media content is founded on truth and that revenues support the 'contract'.
- Introduce truth, beauty and goodness as core themes for production and quality control.
- Enable technology developers to support projects and ideas related to the new vision.
- Foster the new peer pressures for truth, freedom, peace and harmony.

Health

We can see the pollution factors at work in the spread of 'global sickness' despite apparent medical and scientific 'breakthroughs'. We have created an exponential growth in damage to our cellular structure, organs and mind – cancers, aids, organ failures, diabetes, schizophrenia, paranoia, stress, violence and so on.

In fact, these are symptomatic of the dis-ease, or fear, in the human mind, and directly attributable to the pollution factors. The situation may be of value to the balance sheets of pharmaceutical corporations but it is a crisis that prevents our balanced evolution. The ongoing degradation is compounded by the vast markets for drugs – legal and illegal – junk food and sedentary life-styles in the 'developed World'. Aply matched by malnutrition, abuse and squalid living conditions in the 'developing World'.

Meantime, long-proven natural remedies and treatments – vitamins, minerals, nutrients, alternative

therapies, indigenous wisdom - which have served mankind ad infinitum are being sidelined, or banned, to support the market for pharmaceuticals. The ongoing process of *Codex Alimentarius* leaves little doubt that a global cartel seeks to hand over the control of natural remedies to the pharmaceutical giants. Bio-engineering, genetic modification and cloning can be seen as further proof that we are 'grasping at the wrong straws'.

Recommended Remedial Works:

- Accept that the pollution factors are at the root of our dis-ease.
- Employ the 'works' as the route to rebalance our selves in peace and harmony.
- Demonstrate and publicise how the human body can self-heal when supported in an educated, 'religious' fashion by the occupier.
- Re-introduce, publicise and support the ancient and natural healing systems that served humankind for countless millennia prior to the last few hundred years of 'body mechanics'.
- Ensure that the understanding of the energy systems of the human body, and their symbiosis with the planet are a vital aspect of the new processes of education.
- Integrate the best of the ancient systems with the best of the modern technologies to ensure best practice and the availability of solutions for global healing.
- Support the processes with the new banking systems.

Food, Water, Land and Utilities

'The centralised food system that continues to emerge was never voted on by the people of the world. It is the product of deliberate decisions made by a very few powerful human actors. This is not the only system that could emerge. Is it not time to ask some critical questions about our food system and about what is in the best interest of this and future generations?'

William Heffernan, Rural Sociologist, University of Missouri.

"The story of the farming crisis in Britain is not just the story of how farmgate prices have plummeted over the last five years sending many British farmers into financial crisis, the crisis in farming is much longer and deeper than that. It is the story of how farming in the UK has been transformed from the occupation of the bulk of the population into a resource and capital-intensive, highly industrialised operation with a dramatic decline in the number of small and family farmers and farm workers. It is also the story of the transformation of the food system from the local/regional supply of food products to the sourcing of lowest-cost agricultural raw materials on the global market."

In country after country, farmers are said to be in 'crisis', a word that only hints at the devastation besetting rural communities. In Europe 200,000 farmers and 600,000 beef producers gave up agriculture in 1999. UK farm income has dropped by as much as 75 percent over the past two years, driving more than 20,000 farmers from the land. British farmgate prices for virtually every commodity — including beef, lamb, milk, pork, chicken, eggs, oilseed rape, fruit and vegetables — are so low that farmers are getting less for them than they cost to produce. *

American farmers are doing no better. Farm income declined by nearly half between 1996 and 1999, with farmgate prices so low at the end of 1998 that pork was selling for barely one-quarter of the farmer's break-even price. The US Department of Agriculture (USDA) estimates that this year's price for major commodities like cotton and soybeans will be the lowest in more than 25 years.*

Meanwhile, real quality in the form of purity, taste and nutritional value has been dramatically lost. This alarming position has been further compounded by attempts to genetically modify vegetable and animal life. In fact, it is plain to see that we are rapidly disposing of the 'free gifts' available on our planet while expending enormous resources to reproduce them. The attempt to justify such madness in the name of progress is symptomatic of the pollution factors at work.

Desertification of our planet is a major issue and its reversal is possible should adequate focus and

expenditure be applied. This, according to the Millenium Ecosystem Assessment, requires management and policy approaches that promote sustainable resource use. Both prevention, which is preferable, and rehabilitation are available solutions. Mass support is required for major policy interventions and changes in management approaches, both at local and global levels. Addressing desertification is critical and essential to meeting the Millennium Development Goals, which aim to eradicate extreme poverty and ensure environmental sustainability, amongst other objectives.

Water supplies across our planet have been sold, along with most other public utilities, to transnational conglomerates. All too often, this has taken place with the connivance of the World Bank, IMF or both. Inevitably, quality and price have become issues determined by the requirement of a 'healthy' bottom line in the books of private corporations. Indeed, it speaks volumes that our planet's surface is more than 70% covered by water, while water pollution and manipulation may now be a greater threat to our peace, or survival, than war itself.

Energy sources, in general, and especially oil and gas, have long been major contributors to the pollution factors due to their extraction process and as sources of conflict, manipulation and war. The development of alternative energy sources such as solar, wind, wave, geothermal and numerous 'free energy' prototypes has been hugely underfunded due to manipulation by vested interests.

Recommended Remedial Works:

- Outlaw all ownership of legal, or other, rights over any forms of life
- Bring into common ownership all knowledge vital to our 'contract'.
- Agree to proliferate a World vision in which life and nature is upheld in awe and gratitude
- Outlaw genetic modification and any attempts at bioengineering.
- Support biodiversity and pure natural, organic produce.
- Guarantee availability of resources, funding, equipment and knowledge for all peoples.
- Focus on reversal of desertification on a global basis.
- Protect water supplies globally from pollution and interference.
- Redirect funding and research to accelerate the development of sources of alternative energy and water supply.
- Employ indigenous experts in the design and implementation of all solutions.
- Provide the essential massive funding increases, matched by reductions in expenditures for genetic engineering and military 'campaigns'.

Academia

The pursuit of knowledge and learning should be encouraged and not maligned unreasonably. However, there is cause for real concern when a hierarchical structure of power and self interest can stifle genuine debate and collaboration, while writing the curricula for our children's education. The structure is further undermined by undue focus on intellectual property rights to protect the vast profits available from the ownership of knowledge.

We should be in no doubt that the 'hallowed portals' of our Universities and other academic institutions have been infiltrated by the 'drivers of the marketplace'. Many academics owe their income and wealth to large corporate interests that fund their research and development projects. Hardly surprising that their findings may tend to favour endorsement of the goods and services produced by those same interests or the educational curricula required to extend their market dominance. It is to be expected that many ideas and products that could benefit humankind are stifled in some form to protect markets and profits. The history of Tesla is a clear example of the power and profits of the few coming before those of the many.

Recommended Remedial Works:

- Expose the flow of funding from vested interests in the corporate world to academia.
- Outlaw the commercial 'high-jacking' of knowledge and research
- Fund research to facilitate successful development of the 'contract' and the 'works'.
- Seek and foster support amongst academics for the 'new world' view.
- Encourage incorporation of CIC's that focus on R&D specifically to improve the 'works'.

Transnational Corporations and Globalisation

"We have given corporations dominion over the sustaining of our lives. They have become sovereign citizens and we have become consumers. They concentrate power and wealth. They design and shape our society and world. They carve our goals and aspirations. They shape our thoughts and our language. They create the images and metaphors of our time, which our children use to define their world and their lives. In other words: what corporations do well, what corporations are designed to be, is the problem." Richard Grossman

In 2000, of the world's 100 largest economic entities, 51 were corporations and 49 were countries. Yet, those corporations employed less than one-third of one percent of the world's population, and that percentage is shrinking. In the United States, the largest 100 corporations buy about 75% of commercial network time and over 50% of public television time as well. As a result, they have undue influence on what is shown on television and what is not. Furthermore, corporate mergers and buyouts mean that T.V. and radio stations, newspapers, and publishing houses are owned by a decreasing number of conglomerates.

In the context of this report, it seems hardly necessary to describe the enormous threat to our ability to complete the 'contract' when such power and influence is concentrated in so few hands. However, we should take the opportunity to replicate and benefit from the same systems and methodology to connect, manage and empower our international 'matrix' of community companies. In the process, we can recruit many of those who work in and operate these huge enterprises as they choose to use their expertise for our 'contract'.

Recommended Remedial Works:

- Assemble a marketing team to develop the initial strategies and messages.
- Market the 'networks' – actual and on-line people and organisations – internationally.
- Build a system to 'train trainers' to extend the marketing plan into communities.
- Develop a business plan to replicate the 'globalisation' structures and systems.
- Recruit expertise from transnational corporations to assist the processes.

Industrial Military Complex

To quote the famous speech of Dwight D Eisenhower as he left office in 1961:

'This conjunction of an immense military establishment and a large arms industry is new in the American experience. The total influence – economic, political, even spiritual – is felt in every city, every Statehouse, every office of the Federal government. We recognize the imperative need for this development. Yet we must not fail to comprehend its grave implications. Our toil, resources and livelihood are all involved; so is the very structure of our society.

...we must guard against the acquisition of unwarranted influence, whether sought or unsought, by the military industrial complex. The potential for the disastrous rise of misplaced power exists and will persist.

..We must never let the weight of this combination endanger our liberties or democratic processes. We should take nothing for granted. Only an alert and knowledgeable citizenry can compel the proper meshing of the huge industrial and military machinery of defence with our peaceful methods and goals, so that security and liberty may prosper together.

A glance around our World shows how right he was and why we must wake up and realise that

human minds filled with fear will always produce conflict. As long as war is profitable it will continue to be 'at the end of the line' of the pollution factors.

Recommended Remedial Works:

- Develop international peer pressure within communities for a massive worldwide drive to end conflict on a people-to-people basis.
- Redirect military budgets and expertise into protection and execution of the 'works'.
- Refocus all attention on support for the 'contract' to ensure peace and harmony prevails.

Political Power

Politics is defined as "social relations involving authority or power". As such, it has always attracted those who seek authority or power over others for whatever apparent or underlying motivations. Certainly, we are all subjects of mental pollution and we should not feign surprise when corruption, self interest and lies permeate political systems and circles of all types everywhere.

So, in general, we get politicians who are trained to operate political systems, which uphold structures and systems that are contributing to the pollution factors. However, politicians, like everybody, wish to keep their jobs, which means retaining power. So, in a debt-based system, they will always follow the dictates of the 'elite' management over the needs and wishes of the electorate. Inevitably, this means maintaining the 'status quo' and perpetuating the pollution factors

The sad truth is that democracy becomes a sham when it results in a minority ruling a majority. For instance, Tony Blair in U.K. was elected in 1997 by 24% of the electorate because only 60% voted. So, the pollution factors are reflected in the general apathy of huge numbers of voters – around 40% of eligible voters in U.K. do not vote in general elections and up to 85% in local elections. Essentially, many people feel that real change is impossible under the prevailing systems. So, the status quo is maintained, entrenched attitudes prevail and the 'screws are tightened' as the 'rot grows'.

Recommended Remedial Works:

- Eliminate apathy by guaranteeing government 'by the people for the people'
- Organise debate amongst local CIC's to agree a common manifesto with a critical path, designed to fulfil the 'contract' in any particular region or country.
- CIC members, selected by their shareholders, stand for local and central government office to ensure delivery of the manifesto and the 'contract'.
- As CIC's take over management of government, they can guarantee delivery of the 'works' as a permanent focus for humankind to self-evolve in freedom, peace and harmony.
- Current politicians can apply to stand for office or as consultants to their own local CIC.

CONCLUSION

We have arrived at a point in our evolution when we are called upon to answer a 'wake up' call. This is a living experience of how evolution actually works for human beings. A truly wonderful opportunity to realise our Oneness with each other and with the infinite Universe. The time to achieve happiness by removing the barriers between our human mind and our consciousness

There are no mistakes in the 'scripting' of our 'play of life'. We cannot fail provided we summon the courage and wisdom to commit and focus our inner spirit. Our strength is in collaboration and cooperation, empowered with the vision of a new World, energised by freedom and excitement, balanced in peace and harmony, and supported with compassion and love.
